DEATH OF CAPT. EVELEGH, OF SHIDE HOUSE.

With regret we have to record the death of Capt. George Carter Evelegh, of Shide House, Newport, who passed peacefully away early yesterday morning, at the advanced age of 83, having survived his wife somewhat over a year. The deceased gentleman was the son of the late General Evelegh, of Standen, and brother of Col. Evelegh, who greatly distinguished himself in the Crimea and in India, and also another Capt. Evelegh, who preceded him in the occupation of Shide House. The late Capt. Evelegh had for many years lived a life of quiet retirement at Shide, his splendid conservatories and gardens being a source of perennial pleasure to him. He was an enthusiastic supporter of the St. John Ambulance movement, to which his daughter, Miss Evelegh, has rendered such eminent service; and it was only on Monday last, at the annual meeting of the Newport branch, that a vote of sympathy with Capt. Evelegh was passed, the proposer (Mr. F. Pinnock) remarking that he had been a very good and kind friend to them. In connection with this and other good works which the lamented deceased supported with characteristic unostentatiousness he will be much missed. The funeral takes place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Tuesday afternoon next, at 2.30.

THE LATE CAPT. G. C. EVELEGH. – The funeral of the late Capt. George Carter Evelegh, of Shide House, whose death was announced in our last issue, took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Tuesday afternoon last, a large number of sympathizing friends being present at the graveside. The service was impressively performed by the Rev. W. H. Nutter (vicar of St. Paul's, Barton). The family mourners present were Mr. A. Evelegh, Mr. E. C. Evelegh, and Mr. Bonham-Carter Evelegh (sons), Miss Evelegh (daughter), Miss E. A. Carter (sister-in-law), Mr. E. W. Carter (brother-in-law), Capt. C. M. Evelegh, 32nd Light Infantry, Capt. E. G. Evelegh, R.M.L.I., and Mr. Edward Carter, J.P. (nephews). Amongst others also present were Dr. Barr (deceased's medical attendant), Mr. and Mrs. George Smith (Furzcode), Mr. John Dashwood, Mr. Harry Knight, Mr. F. A. Joyce, Mr. J. Arnott,

Mrs. W. H. Nutter, the Rev. Clement E. Pike, Mr. T. S. Buckler, T.C., Mr. and Mrs. W. T. Allison, the Misses Bailey, and representatives from the Newport division of the St. John Ambulance Association (Messrs. J. R. Hayles, 1st officer, F. W. Barkshire, and F. Peach). The superintendent (Mr. H. L. Lawes) was unavoidably prevented from attending. There also attended several present and past employees, including Messrs. W. Morris (head gardener), H. Cooke (under gardener), C. Dyer, B. Willis, and T. Rolfe, Miss E. Flux, Mr. and Mrs. Tubb, Mrs. H. Williams, Miss K. Drake, and Miss Bevis. There were several beautiful floral tokens. The coffin, which was of polished oak, bore the following inscription on the breastplate : “George Carter Evelegh, died Feby. 24, 1899, aged 83 years.” Mr. J. Bevis was the undertaker.
