DEATH OF MR. W. J. EVERETT. – We have to record the death of Mr. William James Everett, which took place on Wednesday last, at the age of 69. Mr. Everett was for many years a prominent figure in Nodehill. He took an active interest in the Ratepayers' Protection Association in its early days, and was for some time known as "the Mayor of the new borough." Years ago his friends nominated him for the South Ward in opposition to Mr. Robert Pinnock, now an alderman of the borough, but a correspondent informs us that when Mr. Everett found that his candidature was being seriously pressed, he went round to his supporters and begged them to vote for Mr. Pinnock, as he was too good a public man to be lost to the town. Our correspondent thinks this fact ought to be mentioned now, as showing that any opposition which Mr. Everett afterwards offered to public measures brought forward by Mr. Alderman Pinnock could not have been prompted by personal feelings. We believe that Mr. Everett was at one time a Guardian for Carisbrooke, and it is claimed for him that he was always ready to champion the cause of the poor to the full extent of his power.
