Mr. F. J. Fallick.--Mr. Frederick James Fallick, 88, died at his home in Clarence Road, Newport. Born at North Park, Calbourne, he was the eldest child of Mr. Frederick Fallick, former head gamekeeper on the Swainstone Estate, under Sir John Simeon. During his childhood he lived in Ningwood and Porchfield and finished his education at Portland House Academy, Newport. During the first war he served in the Royal Berkshire Regiment, being seriously injured in 1917. In 1920, he married Miss Eva Mary Holbrook, of Porchfield, and they lived in Yarmouth until 1923 when they moved to Newport. Since 1923, both had been actively associated with the Quay Street Methodist Church, Newport. Mr. Fallick had been a member of the choir for the whole of the period. He also served in the Sunday School for 37 years and was a trustee and society steward at the church for a number of years. He was a former trustee of Gunville and Porchfield Methodist churches. He was employed as an accountant with Messrs. G. H. Brown and Son for 30 years. The funeral service, at Quay Street Methodist Church, conducted by the Rev. E. J. Renouf, was followed by interment at Carisbrooke Cemetery. Mourners included Mrs. Fallick (widow), Mr. and Mrs. N. L. Fallick (son and daughter-in-law), Miss E. Fallick, Mr. and Mrs. H. J.
