ODDFELLOW'S FUNERAL. – On Sunday afternoon last the funeral of Mr. Frank Payne, who had been engaged as coachman to Dr. Groves till laid aside by the illness to which he succumbed, took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery amid many manifestations of respectful sorrow. Deceased was a member of the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Oddfellows, and a large company of the members of the Lodge, together with several Foresters, attended the obsequies. Dr. Groves walked with the members of the Friendly Societies. The coffin, which was covered with floral tributes from relatives and sympathising friends, including one from the Rev. E. Boucher James, was borne on an open hearse. The Rev. F. Roger officiated, and at the conclusion of the ceremony the Oddfellows' burial service was read by the Lecture Master, Bro. F. B. Meager. The entire funeral expenses were defrayed by Dr. Groves. The widow wishes, through our columns, to tender her heartfelt thanks to Dr. Groves especially and to many kind friends for their practical expressions of sympathy during her husband's long illness and in her bereavement.
