

## Edward Griffin Way

**Obituary.** - An esteemed resident, who was well known to island farmers by reason of his trade as a saddler, passed away at 17 West-street on Friday week in the person of Mr. Edward Griffin Way, aged 73. Mr. Way was a native of Wootton, but spent most of his life here. After being apprenticed to the late Mr. Urry, in Pyle-street, he joined the 14th Hussars as a saddler and saw active service with them in South Africa. After the war he returned to civil life and had since been employed at the late Messrs A. and W. Urry's and the late Mr. W. Coombes's establishments. He was a member of the South African War Veterans Association. His wife died in 1937, and he leaves two daughters and four sons. The funeral was on Tuesday, the Vicar (the Rev. W. M. B. Hogg) officiating at a service in the Parish and at the interment in Carisbrooke cemetery. The mourner were, Mesdames V. Way and H. Bull (daughters), Messrs. G., L., F., and H. Way (sons), Mrs. H. Way (daughter-in-law) Messrs. J. and H. Way (brothers), Mrs. A. Hart (niece), Mrs. W. Way, and Mr. H. Coombes. The following members of the South African War Veterans Association attended with their banner: Messrs. H. Godwin, T.C. Ferguson. Newnham, Capelhorn, Payne, Everett, and Lawn, and the floral tributes included one from the Association. Messrs. Hamilton and Son made the arrangements.
