The Late Mr. H. Wise.- The death took place at St. Mary's Hospital on Tuesday of Mr. Harold Wise, of Muriel Cottage, Albany Road, at the age of 65. He was the eldest son of the late Mr. J. R. Wise, grocer, of Hunnyhill. During the first world war he served in Princess Beatrice's I.W. Rifles, gaining the rank of sergeant, and took part in the landing at Suvla Bay, being invalided home shortly afterwards. After the war he returned to assist his father in his business, and remained there until it was disposed of following his father's death. For some years he had been employed as a storeman by Messrs. Upward and Rich. Mr. Wise was a very keen sea fisherman, and a member of the I.W. Angling Society. He leaves a widow, formerly Miss E. Melhuish. His funeral service will be at the Congregational Church to-day.
