The Late Mr. A. W. Geary. – The funeral took place on Saturday of Mr. Albert William Geary, of 32 Orchard Street, who died on Wednesday week at the Royal I.W. County Hospital, Ryde, aged 58. Mr. Geary was in the employ of Messrs. Neat Bros, ironmongers, for over 30 years, and for the last five years had worked at the local garage of the Southern Vectis Omnibus Company. During the 1914-18 war he served in the Royal Field Artillery. He was formerly a member of the St. John's Athletic Club. The service at the Carisbrooke Cemetery Chapel was conducted by the Vicar of St. Paul's, Barton (the Rev. L. J. D. Wheatley). The mourners were the Misses G. and M. Geary (daughters), Mr. A. Geary (brother), Messrs. G. Arnold, B. Jacobs, and W. Flux (brothers-in-law), Mrs. A. Geary (sister-in-law), Mrs. E. Brown (niece), Mr. B. Eady, and Mr. R. Huxley. Others present included Mr. G. R. Paddock (representing the Grapes Inn) and representatives of the management and staff of the Southern Vectis Omnibus Company. The bearers were Messrs. R. S. Elliott, W. Barton, H. Hemming, and F. Daish (all S.V.O.C. drivers). Messrs. O. C. Hamilton and Son made the arrangements.
