

## Lilian Ethel Bricknell

### NEWPORT

**Death of Miss L. E. Bricknell.**— Her many friends in the town, especially in the Hunnyhill district, will learn with regret of the sudden death, which took place at 7 Holyrood-street on Sunday, of Miss Lilian Ethel Bricknell. The deceased, who was 47 years of age, was an ardent worker at the Hunnyhill Methodist Church, where she had been a Sunday school teacher and class leader and had held other offices for over 25 years. She was also a member of the Pyle-street Methodist Church Women's Work Section. A daughter of the late Mr. George Bricknell, she had assisted her sister and brother-in-law (Mr. and Mrs. C. Burton) in their grocery business. The funeral took place on Wednesday, a service being conducted at the house by the Rev. J. Matthewman, and the interment being at Newport Cemetery. The mourners were Mr. A. Bricknell (brother), Mr. and Mrs. C. Burton (brother-in-law and sister), Mesdames Wheeler and Jolliffe, and Miss Hunt (cousins), and Mesdames Dore and Catton. Members of deceased's Sunday-school class formed a guard of honour at the entrance to the Cemetery. The large number of beautiful floral tributes included wreaths from the Hunnyhill Church and Sunday-school; Girls' Bible Class; Fellow class members; Young Men's Club (Hunnyhill); her Sunday-school class; the Victoria Methodist Church; and the Newport branch of Women's Work.
