Death of Customs Officer.- The death occurred on Tuesday at St. Mary's Hospital, of Mr. William Edgar Burnard, aged 59, of 41 Fairlee Road. Mr. Burnard, who returned to the town in April, 1941, was due to retire at the end of this month. He had been in bad health since Easter. During the first world war he served in the postal section of the Royal Fusiliers and between 1915 and 1919 was twice mentioned in despatches. During these years he was stationed in the Middle East and was afterwards awarded the M.S.M. and the Serbian silver medal. When demobilised in 1919, he joined the staff of Customs and Excise, working in Scotland, Northern Ireland, Newhaven, London, and finally in Newport. Mr. Burnard lived with his sister. Miss D. M. Burnard, the assistant town clerk. The funeral took place yesterday at St. Paul's Church.
