DEATH OF MR. CHARLES JOLLIFFE. - We regret to have to record the death of Mr. Charles Jolliffe, which took place on Sunday last, at the age of 69. The deceased was a well-known and respected inhabitant of Newport. He took an active part in the formation of the Newport Literary Society, was for many years a prominent member of the Newport Debating Society, and in late years he had earnestly associated himself with the temperance movement. His funeral took place on Thursday at the Newport Cemetery, the service being performed by the Rev. A. O. Lochore. In addition to the relatives of the deceased, the funeral was attended by Messrs. E. H. F. Payn, W. H. Day, W. Herbert, F. Sheath, A. Kemp, and E. L. Hayles, representing the Isle of Wight Temperance and Band of Hope Union, which has lost in Mr. Jolliffe one of its most zealous officers and workers. The coffin was covered with beautiful floral wreaths.
