RETIRED NEWPORT BUSINESSMAN'S DEATH

MR. E. A. KIME

The death took place on Thursday of Mr. Ernest Alfred Kime, of Morgan's Farm, Chale, aged 84, well-known as a photographer and art dealer who conducted a business in Lower St. James's Street, Newport, for many years. Mr. Kime retired and disposed of his business shortly after the death, in June 1957, of his wife, Mrs. Frances Kime, who was a native of Osgodby, Lincs, and was the only daughter of the late Alderman John Mills, who was twice mayor of Lincoln.

Mr. Kime was a native of Lincoln, and first came to the Island in 1896 as manager of the business he later owned, which was then carried on by Mr. John Long. After a short time he went to Hull, and about two years later bought the business from Mr. Long. Mr. Kime became a very well-known and respected member of the Island capital's business community, and established an enviable reputation for skilful and artistic work.

The funeral service will take place on Monday, at 2 p.m., at the Victoria Methodist Church, Pyle Street, Newport.

Funeral of Mr. E. A. Kime. – The funeral took place on Monday of Mr. Ernest Alfred Kime, of Morgan's Farm, Chale, whose death was reported last week. A service at the Victoria Methodist Church, Pyle Street was conducted by the Minister (the Rev. D. J. Creamer). In a tribute Mr. Creamer referred to Mr. Kime's connections with the church and of his generous contributions to special causes. The service included the singing of the hymns "Jesu, lover of my soul" and "In heavenly love abiding." The organist was Mr. H. F. Payn. The mourners were Mr. and Mrs. C. J. Linington and Mr. and Mrs. L. G. White (sons-in-law and daughters). Representatives at the service included those from the Albany Lodge of Freemasons and Messrs. Roach Pittis and Co. Interment followed at Newport cemetery in the grave of his wife. The arrangements were made by H. and F. Damp, Ltd.
