### NEWPORT.

**DEATH OF MR. G. G. BURNETT.** – We much regret to record the death, which took place on Monday morning after a short illness, of Mr. George Gray Burnett, aged 61, cabinet-maker, of High-street, and for upwards of 40 years an esteemed and valued chorister at St. Paul's, Barton, of which church he was also a sidesman. Deceased had a very pleasing tenor voice and he will be greatly missed at St. Paul's, to which he was devoted, as gifts of several articles of furniture which he made and presented to the church testify. The deepest sympathy is felt with the widow and bereaved family. The funeral took place at St. Paul's on Thursday afternoon, the Vicar (the Rev. W. H. Nutter) officiating. The service in the church was chorally rendered by his chorister colleagues, including the Misses Nutter, Wells, Corbett, Self, Smith, Foster, and Dunn, Messrs. W. Dore and A. Dockrill, and Capt. Fiske (Church Army). ... Mr. A. Wells played "O rest in the Lord" on the organ at the commencement of the service, and Chopin's "March Funebre" at the close. Major Henry J. Way (churchwarden) was among those present in the church, and, in addition to relatives, the mourners included old friends of the deceased.
