Death of Mr. F. A. Lines. – The funeral took place on Saturday of Mr. Frank Albert Lines, of 37 Nelson Road, who died on Tuesday week at St. Mary's Hospital, aged 40. He was the son of Mr. G. Lines, of 11 Beech Road. Until seven years ago, when he had to give up work because of ill-health, he was employed by Messrs. Saunders-Roe as an engineer. As a boy he joined the I.W. Rifles' Cadets and later became a member of the battalion, attaining the rank of sergeant. At the outbreak of the last war he joined the Army, but in 1940, while he was being trained as an officer, he was invalided out of the service. A keen footballer, he was formerly a prominent member of the Carisbrooke Club. He was a member of the Mount Joy Ward Labour Party. Much sympathy is felt with his widow, son, and daughter. The Vicar (the Rev. L. J. D. Wheatley) officiated at the service in St. Paul's Church. The mourners were Mrs. Lines (widow), Miss B. Lines (daughter), Mr. P. Lines (son), Mr. and Mrs. G. Lines (father and mother), Mr. and Mrs. G. Lines (brother and sister-in-law), Mrs. E. Boverstock, and the Misses M. and E. Lines (sisters), Pte. G. Lines (nephew), Mrs. E. Saunders and Miss K.
