An Airman's Funeral. – The funeral of Corpl. W. J. Nobbs, R.A.F., took place in St. Paul's Church on Saturday, the Rev. H. Ewbank, R.D., conducting the service. The mourners were the widow, Mr. W. J. C. Nobbs (son), Mrs. W. J. C. Nobbs (daughter-in-law), Messrs. C., E., and A. Nobbs (brothers), Mrs. A. Foss (sister), Mr. C. Hayward (father-in-law), Mesdames A. Nobbs and B. Butchers (sisters-in-law), Messrs. J. Nobbs, E. Buckett, and L. Williams (nephews), and Messrs. W. Miles and B. Butchers (brothers-in-law). Also attending were Mrs. W. Hyde, Mrs. C. Matthews, Mr. and Mrs. P. Ray, and Messrs. W. J. Scott and A. Williams. There were floral tributes from his sorrowing wife; ; pals at the workshop, R.A.F. Morpeth; all at the Stars, Whalton; airman's mess; officers' mess; and sergeants' mess, R.A.F. Morpeth; ... The coffin was draped with the Union Jack and borne by aircraftmen from an R.A.F. Station.
