DEATH OF MRS. F. SHUTLER.-Much regret is felt at the passing away on Sunday of Mrs. Elizabeth Florence Olive Shutler, wife of Mr. Frank Shutler, of Lower St. James's-street, and only daughter of the later Mr. J. D. Self. The deceased was a member of a well-known and highly-respected Newport family. She had been in failing health for about three months, but the end was quite sudden. She leaves three children. The deceased, who was 47, for many years assisted her father (who died in March last) in the business carried on by him for a very long period in Lower High-street. A capable vocalist, she was formerly a member of St. Paul's Church choir and of the Philharmonic Society. The interment took place at Barton Cemetery on Wednesday, the first part of the service being held in St. Paul's Church. The Vicar (the Rev. Miles Atkinson) officiated. The choir were present and the hymns "Nearer, my God, to Thee" and "Abide with me" were sung. Mr. Leslie Dore presided at the organ. The chief mourners were the husband, Mr. J. A. Self (brother), Miss Elizabeth Shutler (sister-in-law), Messrs. G. and F. Shutler (brothers-in-law), Mrs. Ellen Self, of Sandown (aunt), Mr. J. E. Cole (cousin), Mr. and Mrs. W. W. Dore, Mr. H. W. Dore, Mr. F. Billows, Nurse Blake, and the Misses F. Horscroft and R. Harvey. Others present included Mr. F. Pitt, Mrs. R. Sweetman, and Mrs. Matthews. There were many beautiful floral tributes.
